## Instructions

We would like to remind applicants to show up NO MORE THAN **15** minutes prior to their visa appointment. Please remember that if you arrive at the Embassy with an electronic device other than a cell phone and a key fob, you will be **TURNED AWAY**. The Embassy **CANNOT** store bags, backpacks, or tablet/computer equipment.

Please tell the security guard the total number of visa applicants in your party, including any minor children, even if they do not need to appear for an interview.

### What do I need to bring?

- Required documents:

1. Interview Appointment Confirmation Letter
2. DS-160 Confirmation Page
3. MRV Fee payment receipt
4. Passport (bring all available passports, particularly those with previous U.S. visas)
5. One Recent Photo (*white background only*)

- Suggested supporting documents:

1. **Students:** latest school results, transcripts and diplomas. As well, bank statements, fixed deposit slips, or other evidence of financial support
2. **Working adults:** employment letter, most recent three months of pay slips, and bank statements. \*If you are going to attend training, bring a detailed training schedule
3. **Business owners:** company registration, annual reports and income statements, and company bank statements
4. **Parents applying for children under the age of 14:** children's birth certificates

- Bring at least one additional photo ID, in addition to your passport for access to the embassy.

### NOTICE TO ALL VISA APPLICANTS:

Prior to coming to the embassy for your interview, you should check the U.S. Embassy website <http://malaysia.usembassy.gov/visas.html> to ensure that it is open. If the Embassy is closed, instructions on how to proceed with your interview appointment will be posted on the website.

For the safety and security of all applicants and employees, visa applicants are NOT PERMITTED to bring the following into the Embassy:

- battery-operated or electronic devices such as digital diaries, digital watches, pagers, cameras, audio/video cassettes, compact discs, MP3s, floppy disks, laptops, or portable music players
- large shoulder bags/purses - only bags that can be carried by hand will be permitted
- bags such as travel bags, backpacks, briefcases, suitcases, leather, cloth bags, and zip folders - you can only carry plastic bags containing application-related papers
- food items
- sealed envelopes or packages
- cigarettes, cigars, match boxes, lighters
- sharp objects such as scissors, pen knives or nail files
- weapons or explosive materials of any kind

***For IMMIGRANT OR FIANCÉ(E) VISA APPLICANTS, please bring:***

1. This appointment letter (all pages)
2. DS-160 (K visas) or DS-260 (Immigrant visas) confirmation page
3. Fee Receipt for K visas, or if applicable
4. Passport (bring all available passports)
5. One recent Photo (*white background only*)
6. All documents listed in the “Immigrant and K Visa Applicant Appointment Package/Instructions”

If you are missing any of the required documents listed in the aforementioned “Immigrant and K Visa Applicant Appointment Package/Instructions” on the day of your interview, a consular officer may refuse your case under Section 221(g) of the U.S. Immigration and Nationality Act. While a 221(g) refusal can be overcome once you provide the missing documentation and a consular officer has reviewed it, having all of the required documents on the day of the interview may prevent unnecessary delays in processing your case.

*When should I come to the Embassy?*

The time on the appointment letter is the time to arrive at the Embassy gate. It is not the time for your interview with the consular officer. Please do not arrive earlier, as you will be asked to leave the gate.
